## TN upgrades Sriperumbudur, Mamallapuram and Thiruvaiyaru to municipalities

Chennai, Aug 14: The state municipal administration and water supply department (MAWS) has issued orders allowing the upgrading of Sriperumbudur in Kancheepuram district and Mahabalipuram in Chengalpattu district as second-grade municipalities from the present status of town panchayats.

Along with Mahabalipuram and Sriperumbudur, Thiruvaiyaru in Thanjavur district has also been upgraded to a second-grade municipality.

As per the order dated August 12, department minister KN Nehru made an announcement in the 2023-2024 budget session to upgrade the

town panchayats as municipalities.

Based on the announcement, collectors of the respective districts directed the councils of Mahabalipuram, Sriperumbudur and Thiruvaiyaru to pass resolutions permitting the upgradation.

The order said that several industries are around Sriperumbudur

town panchayat and if additional infrastructure is provided, the town will grow further. In the cases of Mahabalipuram and Thiruvaiyaru, the department justified the upgradation by pointing out tourist attractions (Mahabalipuram) and the presence of the Thiagarajar temple (Thiruvaiyaru).

## Governor's At Home: AIADMK participates; DMK, allies boycott

Chennai, Aug 14: The 78th Independence Day of the nation will be celebrated tomorrow.

In honor of the occasion, Tamil Nadu Governor R.N. Ravi is hosting a tea party at the Governor's House, inviting all political parties. Invitations have been

extended by the Governor's House to various parties, including DMK, AIADMK, Congress, and BJP, to participate in the tea party.

AIADMK has announced that it will participate in the Governor's 'At home' reception.

Congress and other

allies of the DMK announced that they will boycott the Independence Day tea party to be hosted by Tamil Nadu Governor R.N. Ravi on August 15.

TNCC President K Selvaperunthagai said his party has decided to abstain from the Independence Day tea party at Raj Bhavan

here as the "activities of the governor have been against the interests of Tamil Nadu and also the duly elected government in the state." VCK chief Thol Thirumavalavan, another ally of the DMK, said his party would give a miss to the tea party in protest against the "anti-Tamil Nadu actions" of Ravi.

## Unemployment biggest curse under Modi Govt: Kharge

New Delhi, Aug 14: Congress President Mallikarjun Kharge on Wednesday criticized the Modi government for allegedly using "questionable employment data for PR purposes," asserting that no amount of "whitewashing" can conceal the harsh reality that millions of job seekers struggle daily with limited employment opportunities.

Kharge referenced a media report on X, highlighting that the Mumbai Police received 1.11 lakh applications from across the state for just 1,257 positions for women constables and women constable drivers.

"Unemployment has been the greatest curse under the Modi government," Kharge stated. He further accused the Modi government of inflating employment

figures by including "unpaid labor" and "one-hour work per week" in their data, calling it a "ridiculous PR exercise."

In Maharashtra, where 1.11 lakh women applied for only 1,257 Mumbai Police constable positions—some forced to sleep on pavements with their children—Kharge said this starkly illustrates the severe unemployment crisis.

Kharge also mentioned that a suicide helpline launched on July 15 by

the Diamond Workers Union in Gujarat had received over 1,600 distress calls from individuals who had either lost their jobs or were struggling with reduced wages that left their households in financial turmoil.

Surat's renowned diamond industry is experiencing a recession, with firms declaring a "10-day vacation" for their 50,000 employees, Kharge added.

## Two killed in fireworks unit blast

Virudhunagar, Aug 14: Two workers died in a blast in a fireworks unit near Srivilliputhur in Virudhunagar district of Tamil Nadu on Wednesday.

The deceased workers have been identified as Karthik of Kunur and Pullakutti of Nagapalyam.

The blast happened in Jayanthi Fireworks at Mayathevanpatti. The unit, which is licensed by the Petroleum and Explosives

Safety Organisation, is owned by Jayaraj Kannan of Sivakasi has subleased the unit.

Around 10am, workers were unloading chemicals from a van to a storage room in the unit. A blast was triggered due to friction, killing two workers. The storage room collapsed.

## No freedom: SC rejects Kejriwal's interim bail plea

New Delhi, Aug 14: Refusing to grant interim bail to Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal, the Supreme Court on Wednesday sought responses of the Central Bureau of Investigation and the Enforcement Directorate by August 23 on the Aam Aadmi Party leader's petition seeking bail and challenging his arrest by the CBI in the Delhi Liquor Policy Scam.

A bench comprising Justice Surya Kant and Justice Ujjal Bhuyan issued notice to the probe agencies, asking them to file their responses in the backdrop of the Chief Minister citing health issues, among others, for seeking bail.

Justice Kant said, "We are not granting any interim bail. We will hear arguments on regular bail only. We will issue notice." The court subsequently listed the matter for August 23.

Senior Advocate Dr Abhishek Manu Singhvi, appearing for Kejriwal, said, "This is a strange

situation. Three orders of release/bail granted under PMLA and this is a rejection of bail in a case not even dealing with section 45 PMLA." Justice Kant asked "No PMLA?" ("Prevention of Money Laundering Act") Singhvi said, "Yes, there are three orders, one in May, one in June and then a regular bail by trial court in ED case which was later stayed. Then the CBI investigated and interrogated me one year ago," Singhvi said.

Justice Kant asked, "What happened to the case when the trial court granted bail?" Singhvi said that the High Court stayed it and it is still going on. Then Supreme Court on July 12 passed a detailed judgment and then this arrest was made by CBI which was an insurance arrest, Singhvi said.

Singhvi said just when the judgment in ED case was to be delivered... CBI arrested. "There are health issues involved? We have pressed for interim bail," Singhvi said.

## Japan to get new PM by Sept

Tokyo, Aug 14: Japanese Prime Minister Fumio Kishida said he will step down in September, ending a three-year term marred by political scandals and paving the way for a new premier to address the impact of rising prices. "Politics cannot function without public trust," Kishida said in a press conference on Wednesday to announce his decision not to seek re-election as the Liberal Democratic Party (LDP) leader. "I will now focus on supporting the newly elected LDP leader as a rank-and-file member of the party," he said. Stung by his party's corruption scandals, Kishida has suffered dwindling support ratings that have dipped below 20%.



Common push puppet toys in the shapes of animals and popular figures can move or collapse with the push of a button at the bottom of the toy's base. Now, a team of UCLA engineers has created a new class of tunable dynamic material that mimics the inner workings of push puppets, with applications for soft robotics, reconfigurable architectures and space engineering.

Inside a push puppet, there are connecting cords that, when pulled taught, will make the toy stand stiff. But by loosening these cords, the "limbs" of the toy will go limp. Using the same cord tension-based principle that controls a puppet, researchers have developed a new type of metamaterial, a material engineered to possess properties with promising advanced capabilities.

The UCLA study demonstrates the new lightweight metamaterial, which is outfitted with either motor-driven or self-actuating cords that are threaded through interlocking cone-tipped beads. When activated, the cords are pulled tight, causing the nesting chain of bead particles to jam and straighten into a line, making the material turn stiff while maintaining its overall structure.

The study also unveiled the material's versatile qualities that could lead to its eventual incorporation into soft robotics or other reconfigurable structures.

1. The level of tension in the cords can "tune" the resulting structure's stiffness - a fully taut state offers the strongest and stiffest level, but incremental changes in the cords' tension allow the structure to flex while still offering strength. The key is the precision geometry of the nesting cones and the friction between them.





stiffen over and over again, making them useful for long-lasting designs that require repeated movements. The material also offers easier transportation and storage when in its undeployed, limp state.

3. After deployment, the material exhibits pronounced tunability, becoming more than 35 times stiffer and changing its damping capability by 50%.

4. The metamaterial could be designed to self-actuate, through artificial tendons that trigger the shape without human control.

"Our metamaterial enables new capabilities, showing great potential for its incorporation into robotics, reconfigurable structures and space engineering," said corresponding author and UCLA Samueli School of Engineering postdoctoral scholar Wenzhong Yan.

"Built with this material, a self-deployable soft

robot, for example, could calibrate its limbs' stiffness to accommodate different terrains for optimal movement while retaining its body structure. The sturdy metamaterial could also help a robot lift, push or pull objects."

According to the researchers, potential applications of the material also include self-assembling shelters with shells that encapsulate a collapsible scaffolding. It could also serve as a compact shock absorber with programmable dampening capabilities for vehicles moving through rough environments.

## DRDO successfully flight tests LRGB

New Delhi, Aug 14: Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO) has carried out a successful maiden flight test of Long Range Glide Bomb (LRGB), GAURAV from Su-30 MK-I platform of the Indian Air Force (IAF).

The test was conducted off the coast of Odisha.

GAURAV is an air launched 1,000 kg class glide bomb capable of hitting targets at long distance, a Defence Ministry statement said.

After being launched, the glide bomb steers towards the target using a highly accurate hybrid navigation scheme with a combination of INS and GPS data.

GAURAV has been designed and developed indigenously by the Research Centre Imarat (RCI), Hyderabad.

During the flight test, the glide bomb hit the target erected at Long Wheeler's island with

pinpoint accuracy. During the test launch, complete flight data was captured by telemetry and electro-optical tracking systems deployed by the Integrated Test Range along the coastline.

Senior DRDO scientists monitored the flight. Adani Defence and Bharat Forge, the development cum production partners also participated during the flight trial. Defence Minister Rajnath Singh complimented DRDO, IAF, and industry for the successful flight test. He termed it a major milestone in the country's effort to develop Indigenous defence technologies to further strengthen the Armed Forces' capability.

Secretary of Department of Defence R&D and Chairman DRDO Samir V. Kamat congratulated the entire DRDO team on conducting the successful flight test of LRGB.

## Hasina asks cadres to observe Aug 15 as mourning day

Dhaka, Aug 14: Former Bangladesh Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina, who has been staying in India since she resigned and left the country on August 5 amid a student-led mass uprising, has started communicating with her Awami League party leaders over the phone and asked them to take the necessary initiatives to observe national mourning day on August 15.

The former Prime Minister made phone calls to her party leaders from India on Thursday, Friday, and Saturday, which several AL leaders confirmed to New Age daily. They said that Hasina asked them to pay tribute to her father and the country's founding President, Sheikh Mujibur Rahman, at Dhammoh-32.

They said that Hasina informed them that party leaders and activists in Gopalganj would observe the day in the district, paying rich tribute at the grave of Sheikh Mujib located in Tungipara of the district.

Bangladesh observes National Mourning Day on August 15 every year to mark the brutal assassination of its founding father, Sheikh Mujibur Rahman, also known as Bangabandhu, and most of his family members on August 15, 1975.

"My leader [Hasina] told me that she would come home soon. She asked us not to feel hapless," a mid-level leader of the AL's Dhaka north city unit told New Age, adding that Hasina asked them to file cases and general diaries with police about recent attacks once the police stations were reopened.

Several AL leaders said that they suspect that Saturday's attack on a patrol team of the army in Gopalganj was caused by some angry leaders and activists. They said that after the AL supporters of Gopalganj, the birthplace of Sheikh Hasina, got a message that she would come back home soon, they became emotional and attacked army personnel.

On Sunday night, at least 10 people, including five army personnel and journalists, were injured as AL leaders and activists attacked army personnel and other people from a demonstration they organised protesting at Sheikh Hasina's "forced resignation". A large group of AL leaders, including ministers and lawmakers, have either fled the country or kept their phones switched off since the resignation of Hasina.

The Hasina Government had had strained relations with the US for many years. Ahead of January's elections this year, she said "a white man" had offered

her smooth return to power in exchange for an airbase.

In her latest statement, Hasina, the longest-

interim Government on Tuesday cancelled a national holiday on August 15. According to a press release issued by the

chief advisor's office, the cancellation of the August 15 holiday was approved in Tuesday's meeting of the advisory council.

## China threatens India tourism with new visa free travel

New Delhi, Aug 14: China's aggressive expansion in the tourism sector is creating significant challenges for neighboring countries like Thailand and India. Through a combination of market-disrupting strategies and expansive visa free travel policies, China is reshaping the tourism landscape in Asia, posing a direct threat to the tourism industries of these nations.

Chinese investments in Thailand's tourism sector have rapidly increased, particularly through small-scale operations that undercut local businesses. The Association of Thai Travel Agents (ATTA) has raised concerns over the rise of "market-busting tours," where Chinese travel agencies use Thai nominees to register businesses and offer tours at unsustainably low prices.

These underpriced packages disrupt the market, making it difficult for local operators to compete and harming Thailand's reputation when these tours fail to meet expectations.

S. S. Divachar Cheewarattanaporn, president of ATTA, emphasized that these market-busting tours are even more damaging than the infamous "zero-dollar" tours, which have long been a problem in Thailand. The situation worsens when these tours, which are priced unrealistically low to attract tourists, turn unprofitable. In such cases, tourists might be coerced into spending more or even held until they agree to pay additional fees, leading to negative experiences and tarnishing Thailand's image as a tourist-friendly destination.

# India inching closer to super power status with every step

## Accolades shower on 78th Independence Day

India has made remarkable strides since its Independence, evolving into one of the world's largest democracies. This journey, marked by a series of pivotal decisions, has seen the country rise from the turmoil of Partition to its current status as a formidable global power. Over the past four decades, India has played a crucial role in shifting the global economic focus from Europe and North America to Asia.

India's diverse linguistic landscape, where the language changes every few kilometers, reflects the complexity of governing such a vast nation. Despite these challenges, India has consistently strived for progress. The two-child policy, for instance, has been introduced in Parliament 35 times since Independence, yet it has faced significant criticism and has not been implemented, showcasing the government's cautious approach to reforms.

Agricultural reforms, another critical area, have seen similar hesitancy



on this front, much like agricultural economists and stakeholders have long advocated for market reforms, the government has been reluctant to push through significant changes due to potential backlash. This was evident in the repeal of the three major agricultural reform laws, which were quietly rolled back to avoid further crises. Similarly, the rules on the Labour Code, which could lead to lower take-home pay and easier layoffs, have been deferred, highlighting the delicate balance the government must maintain.

One significant step towards strengthening democracy would be making voting compulsory, a measure already adopted by at least 30 other democracies, leading to voter turnouts exceeding 90%. However, India remains undecided

on this front, much like its stance on genetically modified (GM) crops. Despite the success of the Green Revolution in the 1960s, which dramatically increased food grain production, the political will to adopt modern agricultural policies, including biotechnology, is still lacking.

India has also made bold moves on the global stage. In 1998, it conducted nuclear tests under "Operation Shakti," establishing itself as a nuclear power despite global pressure for disarmament. More recently, the 2016 demonetisation of Rs 500 and Rs 1,000 notes was a significant, though controversial, step aimed at tackling black money. The introduction of the Goods and Services Tax (GST), which unified various central and state

# TN cabinet clears 15 new private investments totaling Rs. 44,125 cr

Expected to create 24,700 job opportunities

Chennai, Aug 14: Tamil Nadu Finance Minister Thangam Thennarasu announced that the State Cabinet has approved 15 new private investments totaling Rs.44,125 crore, expected to create 24,700 job opportunities. During a briefing at the Secretariat, Finance Minister Thennarasu and Industries Minister T.R.B. Rajaa provided details on these projects. Thennarasu highlighted that the Cabinet approved investment proposals spanning various sectors, including automobiles, electronics, food processing, renewable energy, and battery manufacturing. Notably, Sembcorp plans to invest Rs.21,340 crore in Thoothukudi district, generating over 1,100

jobs, while Motherson will invest Rs.2,600 crore in Kancheepuram district, creating more than 2,500 jobs. Additionally, Milky Mist is set to invest Rs.1,777 crore in Erode district, and Lohum Tech will invest Rs.1,597 crore in Krishnagiri district for lithium battery recycling.

The Cabinet also approved three policies for the Energy Department, focusing on pumped storage projects, small hydel projects, and wind energy repowering, refurbishment, and life extension. The new policies aim to boost renewable energy employment and increase wind energy production by 25% through targeted upgrades and maintenance.

Furthermore, the Cabinet approved the

expansion of Global Capability Centres for UPS and AstraZeneca. Thennarasu mentioned that the policy for pumped storage projects is part of the State's goal to install 20,000 MW of solar power by 2030.

In a related development, Chief Minister M.K. Stalin is set to inaugurate a housing facility for Foxconn workers at SIPCOT Vallam Vadagal

Tamil Nadu accounts for 15 per cent of India's MSME sector: Minister

Chennai, Aug 14: Tamil Nadu accounts for 15 per cent of the country's micro, small and medium enterprises sector, employing about 14 million people, Minister for Industries T R B Rajaa said on Tuesday.

As much as 30 per cent of the state's industrial output is contributed by the MSME sector, he said at an event here.

The state leads in women-run micro, small and medium enterprises with over 10 lakh units helmed by them, Rajaa said, after launching the Confederation of Indian Industry Tamil Nadu Micro Entrepreneurs Forum here, in the presence of CII Director General Chandrajit Banerjee, CII past president R Dinesh and CII Southern Region Chairperson R Nandini, among others. "As we

launch this new CII project aimed at supporting micro enterprises, I want to emphasise the government's commitment to fostering entrepreneurship and job creation.

The MSME sector alone contributes to 30 per cent of the state's industrial output and 45 per cent of exports," Rajaa said.

According to CII officials, micro entrepreneurs of Chennai, Coimbatore, Tiruppur, Erode, Karur, Tiruchirappalli, Madurai, Tuticorin and Salem will be supported under the initiative, initially.

"The first ever intervention of the Centre of Excellence on Employment and Livelihood is starting in Tamil Nadu, thanks to the support of key departments in the state," CII's erstwhile president Dinesh said.
